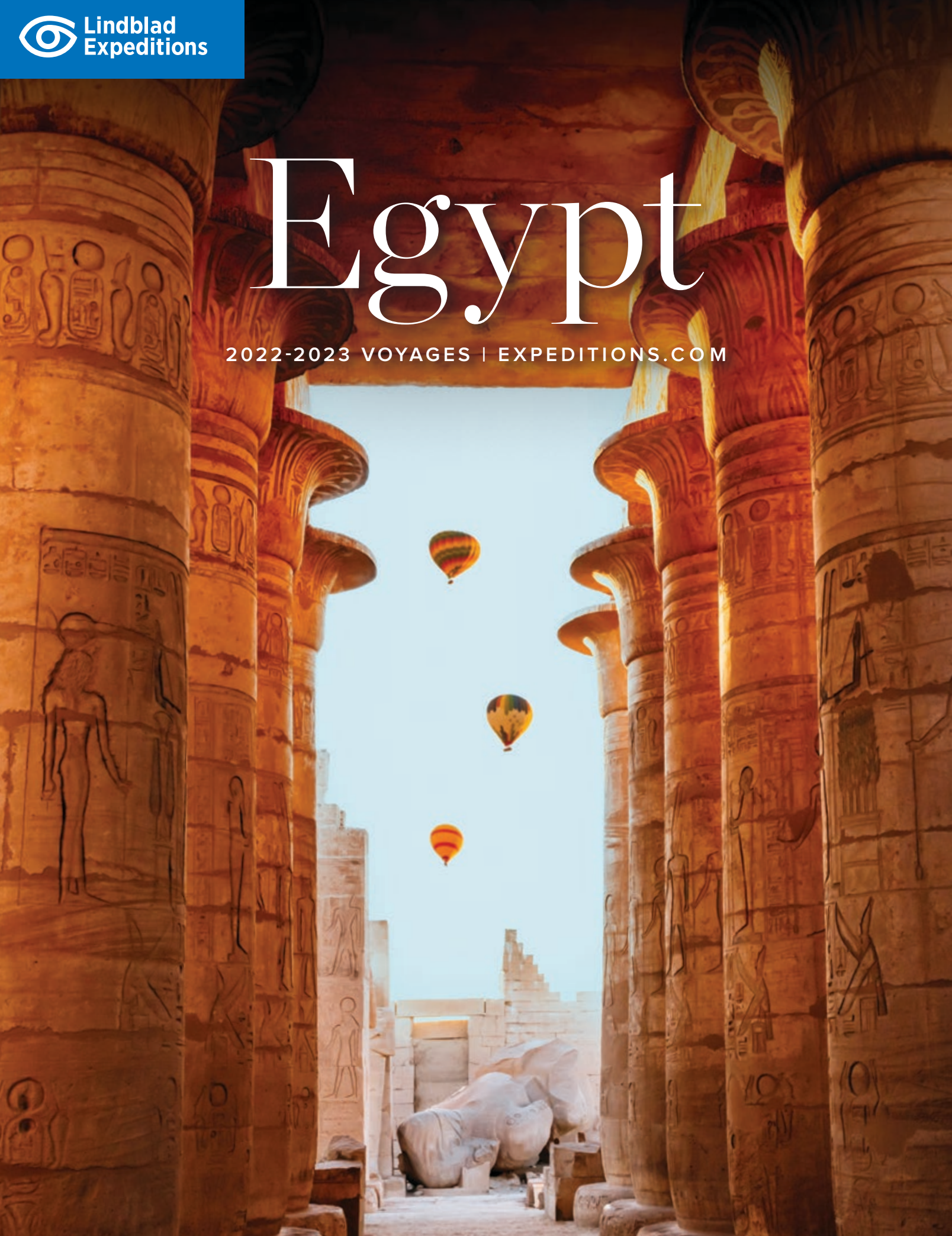

You will experience Egypt's legendary beauty and antiquity from the most luxurious ship on the Nile as well as the finest accommodations. For added ease and enjoyment, gratuities are included.

## ***Oberoi Philae***

Our 6-night voyage along the Nile is the centerpiece of your journey, and few ships — if any — compare to the *Oberoi Philae*. Elegant, intimate and gracious, it was originally built for 100 guests but remodeled in 2015 to accommodate just 44 in unparalleled style.

Her 22 cabins, including 4 suites, are spacious and comfortable. Large windows offer panoramic views of life along the river. Gather at the swimming pool on the top deck to relax with new



friends in the sun or cool off with a quick dip. Discover the ship's nooks and private areas where you can sit on your own or in small groups. An al fresco dining area lets you take in the air over lunch.

Since we have exclusively chartered this ship, you will travel only with other Lindblad Expeditions guests and your expedition team, fostering a welcoming sense of community. Each day, you'll experience all the hallmarks of a Lindblad Expeditions voyage, including engaging gatherings in the lounge, informative presentations by expert Egyptologists, and the services of our certified photo instructor.

## **Private Aircraft**

Chartered aircraft with only our group aboard for flights within Egypt means we travel at ideal times and aren't at the mercy of commercial air disruptions. Practically, it means you'll have the luxury of exploring at your own pace in places like Abu Simbel, where tours are typically rushed.





### **The Nile Ritz-Carlton**

Situated in the heart of Cairo along the east bank of the Nile, this premier hotel is a short walk to the Egyptian Museum and ideally located for seeing Cairo's other sights. From your Nile-view room you'll look across the river to Gezira Island and the Cairo Tower and, if the weather cooperates, the Pyramids in the distance.







## ANTIQUITY COMES ALIVE: EXPLORE THE EGYPT OF YOUR DREAMS

**DESCEND INTO HIDDEN CHAMBERS, ADORNED WITH VIVID DEPICTIONS OF ANCIENT** gods and goddesses, the underworld and afterlife, mystical incantations, and colorful scenes once sealed into darkness for millennia. Bewilder at the works of powerful dynastic families, speaking to you of their prominence from across the centuries through mesmerizing stories and depictions carved on the walls, pylons, and obelisks of their legendary desert temples.

By special arrangement, take in the royal tombs of Seti I with its vaulted deep blue ceiling; of Nefertari whose lovely likeness lines the walls in exquisite color; and of Tutankhamun, the storied “boy king” whose meager burial chamber belies the breathtaking riches Carter found within.

Gaze up at the towering 65-foot statues of Rameses the Great at Abu Simbel, and marvel at how two million stones were masterfully engineered to create the Great Pyramid of Cheops. Take in the awe-inspiring ceiling at Dendera, and Karnak Temple’s 134 massive columns in the Great Hypostyle Hall.

One highlight follows another on this epic adventure into antiquity. This is the Egypt you’ve dreamed of exploring.

**ANCIENT WONDER**

See the legendary vast treasures of the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities, shop for exotic spices and handicrafts at the bustling open-air Khan el-Khalili Bazaar, and explore Cairo's many aspects from Islamic, Ottoman, and Pharaonic.

**PYRAMIDS OF GIZA**

Ride a camel to the base of the Great Pyramids and follow a narrow passageway under the pyramid to the Grand Gallery and burial chamber of Cheops. Plus, visit Saqqara to see the famous Step Pyramid of the pharaoh Djoser and the tomb of Mereruka.

**RIVER LIFE**

Catch a glimpse of Egyptian life on the banks of the Nile. Visit Dendera to see a beautifully preserved temple with reliefs depicting the empress Cleopatra.

**VALLEY OF THE KINGS**

Explore Luxor's fabled west bank, traveling through lush farmland to the Valley of the Kings, to enter the tombs of some of Egypt's greatest pharaohs and queens, such as Seti I and Nefertari.

**TWO-GOD TEMPLE**

Sail to Kom Ombo, set on a hill overlooking the Nile and built during the Ptolemaic era. It is dedicated to the hawk-headed Haroeris and crocodile-headed Sobek.

**STUNNING TEMPLE**

At Esna, explore the striking Temple of Khnum, dedicated to the ram-headed god of creation. Then walk through the contemporary town to get a glimpse of village life in Egypt.

**DEATH ON THE NILE**

Savor stunning views and high tea at the Old Cataract Hotel, made famous by Agatha Christie. Visit the island temple of Philae, and encounter Nubian culture at the museum in Aswan.

**MOVING HISTORY**

Fly by private air to Abu Simbel and explore the two great temples built by Ramses II, which were both moved block by block to higher ground before the Nile was dammed.







## OBEROI PHILAE

Her scale, décor, and renowned service defines *Oberoi Philae* as the finest ship on the Nile. She has the intimate size and appointments of a luxury yacht, with the spaciousness and gracious hospitality of a luxury hotel. Savor her private and public spaces—with complimentary wireless internet access throughout the ship.

**CAPACITY:** 44 guests in 22 cabins including 4 suites (2 with private terrace and jacuzzi tub).

**REGISTRY:** Egypt. **OVERALL LENGTH:** 235 feet.

The *Oberoi Philae* originally began service in 1996, configured at the time with 50 cabins and with a maximum capacity of 100 guests. A multiyear renovation completed in 2015 converted her into an extraordinarily beautiful, private ship, with just 22 cabins, modern amenities, and a relaxed, elegant ambiance.

**PUBLIC AREAS:** There is a great deal of attractive and comfortable public space. Deck E is a perfect place to relax and watch life along the Nile. The 36-foot-long swimming pool, surrounded by lounge chairs, is among the largest of any Nile ship. Some meals are served al fresco in the covered sitting area. Deck D has a fully equipped spa with treatment rooms, and there is a

selection of spa treatments and massages available with a professional masseuse as well as a fitness room with cardio and weight machines. Deck C has a lounge and library, ideal for reading about Egyptian history. On Deck B you'll find the main lounge, which is the venue for talks and presentations. And Deck A has the elegant restaurant. There are three water coolers available on board for your convenience to refill personal water bottles.

**MEALS:** Served in single seatings, meals focus on fine Egyptian, Middle Eastern, and Continental cuisine. Refreshments are always available. Lunch is occasionally served on Deck E, weather permitting.

**CABINS:** All cabins and suites are elegant and very spacious. All face outside, with large windows that are almost floor to ceiling, and which open to offer great views of the Nile. There is ample storage space for luggage and personal items. Each cabin has a 40-inch flat panel TV, DVD player, mini-fridge, safe, hair dryer, individual climate controls, and remote control-operated blackout blinds. Laundry service is included. There is a mix of queen-bedded and twin-bedded cabins.

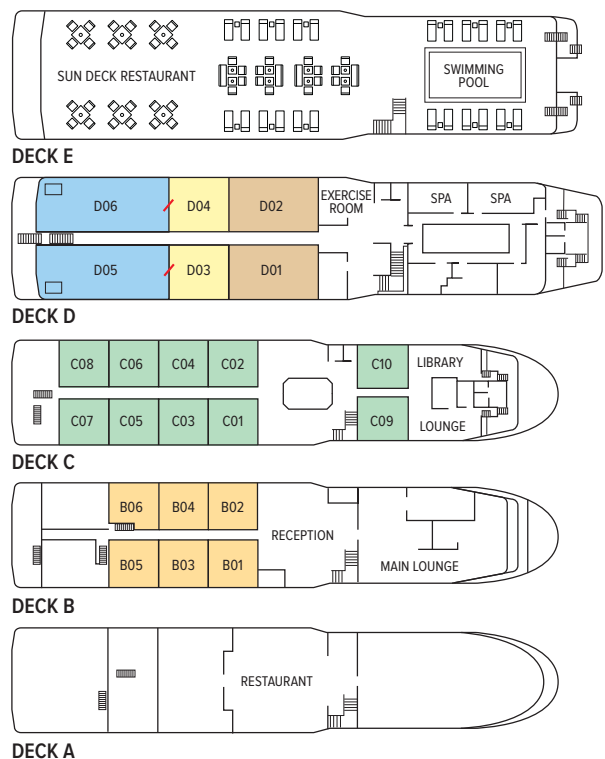
**CATEGORY 1:** #B01-B06: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck B and have single beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sitting area, sliding glass windows with French balcony, and a shower.

**CATEGORY 2:** #C01-C10: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck C and have single beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sliding glass windows with French balcony, and a shower.

**CATEGORY 3:** #D03-D04: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck D and have two single beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sitting area, sliding glass windows with a French balcony, and a shower.

**CATEGORY 4:** #D01-D02: These luxury suites are 580 square feet, located on Deck D and have a queen bed, sliding glass windows with French balcony, separate living area, shower, and a stand-alone tub.

**CATEGORY 5:** #D05-D06: These luxury suites are 580 square feet with a 323 square foot balcony with heated outdoor whirlpool and sun lounger located on Deck D and have a queen bed, sliding glass windows with French balcony, separate living area, shower, and a stand-alone tub.





# EXTENSIONS

**JORDAN IS BREATHTAKING, WITH THE FERTILE JORDAN Valley, the Moabite Mountains, the shores of the Dead Sea, and of course the compelling site of Petra—a place that simply must be seen. In the span of just five days, we'll explore all of them. Beginning in Amman, Jordan's modern capital, we'll step into the past at the Roman ruins of Jerash, where one hundred years of excavation have unearthed only 1% of the city. We continue to Petra, the Nabatean city whose iconic rose-hued facades are carved directly into sandstone cliffs. In Madaba we see the remarkable 6th-century mosaic map. And we'll visit the Dead Sea with a chance to float in its waters and enjoy the hotel amenities. We'll be accompanied by a top guide and will stay in superb accommodations throughout.**


